Anchor Your Soul: 3 Ways to Find Hope in Times of Discouragement

Ester Munt-Brooks / Founder of Fe, Valor y Alegría Our faith tells us that we should hope always, and that hope is a virtue. When times are good, that's easy. But in times of fear and suffering, hope can seem difficult to find and maintain. It doesn't have to be this way. In this talk, you will learn that hope is a commitment, not a feeling. Understanding hope's spiritual roots, we can all get better at it, and make it a dependable pillar of our faith in both good times and bad.

Learning from Europe - 10 Principles for Evangelizing Secular Culture

Fr. George Elsbett, LC | Director, John Paul II Center in Vienna Many would say that Europe is 20-30 years ahead of the USA in the secularizing process. In Austria 92% of Catholics no longer practice their faith. In Vienna only an estimated 1% of under 35-year-olds attend mass regularly. In Germany 38% of the population does not believe that God exists. In the Cech Republic 71% of the population is without any kind of religious affiliation (Christian or otherwise). And yet there are also initiatives that defy this trend. The John Paul II. Center in the diocese of Vienna is one such example. After 10 years of failure and a 3-year transition period, the Center has been experiencing strong growth since fall of 2015. Functioning as a milieu specific parish, it focuses on unchurched young people in downtown Vienna, seeking to capacitate them for missionary discipleship and helping other parishes to do the same. In this breakout session, the director of the Center, Fr. George Elsbett, will discuss the principles involved and why these might be of interest to the anyone in the US having a heart for the Church and wondering how to navigate the increasing secularization in our own country.

Glorifying Christ: The Life and Legacy of Cardinal Francis E. George, O.M.I.

Cardinal Francis E. George, O.M.I., was a model pastor and a heroic disciple of Christ. A native Chicagoan, he was told as a young man that he would never be a priest in Chicago because of a physical disability resulting from polio. He went on to be ordained a priest with the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1963. He was appointed as Archbishop of Chicago in 1997, created a cardinal in 1998, and served in Chicago until 2014, just months before his death at the age of 78.

Cardinal George's many gifts — including his superior intellect — made him a pivotal player in Church affairs nationally and internationally. He governed during difficult and challenging times, yet he always attempted to lead with the heart of Christ, living out his episcopal motto, "To Christ be glory in the Church."

A man of pastoral availability, Cardinal George poured out his life in service to Christ and the Church, always attentive to the poor and those on the margins. Universally admired for his pursuit and proclamation of the truth, and his personal witness to the Gospel, Cardinal George remains a model for discipleship and leadership. By the time of his death in 2015, Cardinal George was regarded as one of the most respected bishops in American Catholic history. His fascinating and inspiring story reminds us that God's ways are always better than our own.

	In 2019, Pope Benedict XVI published a Constitution, <i>Anglicanorum coetibus</i> , which established Ordinariates or non- territorial dioceses to provide governance and pastoral care for communities coming into the Catholic Church from the Anglican tradition. These Ordinariates function in many ways like any other diocese, albeit with some unique features. The clergy and faithful of the Ordinariates have their own proper liturgical form of Mass and the Sacraments that preserves the liturgical and spiritual patrimony of English Christianity as a treasure to be shared with the whole Catholic Church. Most Rev. Steven Lopes, Bishop of the Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter, discusses how this initiative reflects the ecumenical and liturgical vision of Pope Benedict, as well as the missionary impulse of Pope Francis.
