In this session, we will review pro-life objections to physician-assisted suicide (PAS), refute the claims used to promote PAS, and present the current status of the legal landscape in the US on this issue. In addition to providing legislative updates for 2024, we will look ahead to see how states can protect against this growing threat that is relentless and contributes to other anti-life developments in healthcare, such as euthanasia and denial of care. We will also discuss the implications of assisted suicide laws, including a look at how California sought to force physicians to facilitate assisted suicide regardless of their religious and moral objections. The panel will also examine the widespread practice of withholding life-sustaining care, including nutrition and hydration, from patients who are incapacitated and how to protect yourself and your loved ones from an untimely death.

The International Chair of Bioethics Jérôme Lejeune: Educating Servants of Life

The objective of this panel is to introduce the Mission and activity of the International Chair of Bioethics Jerome Lejeune, an independent international center for training, research, and dissemination of Bioethics from an ontologically founded personalistic point of view.

Venerable Jerome Lejeune considered the father of modern genetics, after his discovery in 1958 of trisomy 21, the genetic alteration responsible for Down syndrome, represents a new charism in the life of the Church: The Servant of Life. He opposed the main representatives of the culture of death who pursued the use of his discovery to kill the unborn with genetic diseases. He was candidate twice for the Nobel Prize in Medicine, he did not win it for his advocacy on behalf of his unborn patients with trisomy 21, whom he considered the most vulnerable. St John Paul II wrote of him that he was the "man for whom the defense of life became an apostolate. It is clear that in the current world situation this form of lay apostolate is particularly necessary. Today we wish to thank God, the sole Author of life, for everything that Professor Lejeune was for us, and for all he did to defend and to promote the dignity of human life" (Letter to Card. Jean-Marie Lustiger, Archbishop of Paris, April 4, 1994).

After the life and testimony of Venerable Prof. Jerome Lejeune, the Jerome Lejeune Foundation, originally created in Paris (France) immediately after his death, and with headquarters in different countries, develops a specific advocacy mission through

the academic work in favor of the weakest of the weakest, in different languages. The Jerome Lejeune International Non-Profit Group dedicates to: 1) Medical Care, through outpatient clinics for people with intellectual disabilities and their families; 2) Biomedical Research, after more than 25 years of experience in fundamental and clinical research in favor of people with ID of genetic origin; and 3) to Advocate, defending human life and dignity worldwide, specifically in the situations of big vulnerability.

As a response to the crucial need of rebuilding a culture of life due to the drift of certain positions among many communities; and the subsequent opportunity to educate, in which Prof. Lejeune's scientific knowledge and wisdom appear as a referral and a life-model, the Jerome Lejeune Foundation created in 2009, the International Chair of Bioethics Jerome Lejeune. The ICBJL is an educational service in Bioethics focused on the immense value that the life of every human being has, argued from science and reason. Its inspiration comes from the "Servants of Life" statement drawn up by Prof. Lejeune for the Pontifical Academy for Life. Realism obliges to respect a properly scientific attitude, free from any ideological or political temptation, and it reconciles today's ethics with the natural morality of all time. At the heart of the general cultural battle, the ICBJL brings a personalist, ontologically grounded anthropological vision and virtue ethics, which enables to meet bioethical challenges, targeting tomorrow's decision makers, from Scientists and Physicians to University Professors and Politicians. Through education, scientific research, dissemination and publications and advocacy for the most vulnerable, from conception to natural death, it has become an international reference at the service of human life.

Pope St John Paul II said Catholic health care is “one of the most fundamental works of the Catholic Church in the United States...and one of the most significant services the Church offers to society...which penetrates and transforms the very fabric of American society.” The ministry of Catholic health care has the potential to ignite a spiritual and cultural revival needed to rebuild a culture of life in our country today. However, Christ’s healing ministry in America is threatened by economic and ethical challenges posed by a secularized medical industrial complex that has been infiltrated by a culture of death. This is the mission of the Catholic Health Care Leadership Alliance (CHCLA) launched in 2022 by the Catholic Medical Association, Catholic Bar Association, National Catholic Bioethics Center, Catholic Benefits Association, Christ Medicus Foundation, the Franciscan Alliance Health System and a board of Episcopal Advisors.
