Jesus, who came to serve rather than be served and to give Your life as a ransom for many, Hear me.

- + From a lack of trust that You will bless my faithful service in the best way possible, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From the belief that I have all the answers, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From the temptation to place my will above Yours in my work, *Deliver me, O Jesus*.
- + From neglect of the Sacraments and my life of prayer, *Deliver me, O Jesus*.
- + From a belief that I cannot do what You ask of me even if I rely on You and Your grace, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a desire to manipulate others to get my own way, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From losing sight of the truth that my efforts only have meaning if united to You, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a failure to stay rooted in the Magisterium of the Catholic Church, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From neglecting my family and friends as I work, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a failure to see when I need help and to ask for it, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From the temptation to not be fully present to others, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a lack of concern about whether those who serve the apostolate are able to live balanced lives, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From the mistaken belief that all success is due to human efforts or my own contributions, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a failure to recognize the contributions of others, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From viewing other apostolates or leaders as competitors, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.
- + From a desire to raise my own profile rather than simply do what you are asking of me, *Deliver me*, *O Jesus*.

- + That I must answer for how I treat both those I serve through the work of the apostolate and those who work for me, *Jesus, grant me the grace to lead well and understand.*
- + That I must be a good steward of every resource gifted to the apostolate, *Jesus*, *grant me the grace to lead well and understand*.
- + That the apostolate only matters to the degree it is tethered to You and Your Church, *Jesus, grant me the grace to lead well and understand.*
- + That my obligation is to always seek the thriving of those I invite into the work of the apostolate, *Jesus, grant me the grace to lead well and understand.*
- + That I am dependent on the wisdom and good counsel of others, *Jesus, grant me the grace to lead well and understand.*
- + That I must never take a transactional view of any person who contributes to the apostolate, *Jesus*, *grant me the grace to lead well and understand*.
- + That I may be held to account for any unnecessary discord, pain, rivalries, or poor stewardship that arise from my part as a leader of the apostolate, *Jesus*, *grant me the grace to lead well and understand*.
- + That there will come a time when I must, for the good of the apostolate, willingly pass the work over to new leaders, *Jesus*, *grant me the grace to lead well and understand*.
- + That, at some point, the apostolate will cease to exist, and You, Lord, are the arbiter of when the time has come, *Jesus*, *grant me the grace to lead well and understand*.
- + That no challenge is beyond Your power to overcome in the way You choose, *Jesus, grant me the grace to lead well and understand.*
